Access Classical Guitar – \$5 event at Fiorentino Community Center, Allston

Two classical guitarists performed pieces from around the world, explaining the cultural and historical significance of each piece, inviting questions from the audience.

Nantucket Girl: Be Ready to Sail - \$10 event by Nantucket Cultural District

Nantucket Historical Association presented folk singer and guitarist Susan J. Berman in a concert of debut songs about history and events based in Nantucket, highlighting the role of women in the island's storied past and present at the award-winning Whaling Museum.

Discover Your Inner Voice Vocal – Free event at Studio 550, Cambridge

Singers of all levels were invited to explore their abilities through this workshop that led them through warm-up techniques, improvisation, and exploration through body movement.

No Evil Project Exhibit & Photo Shoot – Free event at Northeastern Crossing, Boston

A photographer invited the public to be a part of his interactive exhibit that challenges stereotypes by showing that people aren't defined by their labels, based on the Three Wise Monkeys.

Recipe-Writing Workshop with the Diva of Deliciousness - Free event in Hawley

Western Massachusetts singer, chef and author Tinky Weisblat welcomed guests into her kitchen for a workshop designed to cultivate inspiration for creative recipe writing techniques, enhancing flavor and significance.

The History of Greek Dance - Free event at St. Spyridon Cultural Center, Worcester

Combining commentary and demonstration, this interactive and educational performance concluded with audience members trying some of the diverse dances from the Hellenic culture.

Wednesday Night Yoga Jam – \$16 event at JP Centre Yoga, Jamaica Plain

A local musician performed live accompaniment to a special open yoga class with music geared towards meditation and healing.

Poe's Boston: Walking Tour – \$15 event, Boston College English Professor

Though Poe spent less than a year living in Boston, he was intensely engaged throughout his career with the writers and editors he called "Frogpondians." This 90-minute tour with the president of the Poe's Studies Association combined history and literature, and supported the installation of Boston Commons' newest sculpture.

BIG ART: Tiny Home – Free event by The Umbrella Community Arts Center

The interactive opening of two tiny house galleries featured artists talking about functional artwork from disciplines as varied as architecture, pottery, woodworking, and more.
