The 90-Second Newbery Film Festival – *Public Library of Brookline*

Held for the first time in Boston, this celebration of kids' creativity showcased short films created by young filmmakers and panels based on Newbery-Award Winning novels.

ACE: The Eugene Bullard Story Play Reading – *Roslindale Branch of Boston Public Library*

This one-time reading of a play about the life of Eugene Bullard was done in partnership with Boston Center for the Arts and Office of War Information.

The Beatles: Band of the Sixties – *Hyannis Public Library, Cape Cod*

Music scholar Aaron Krerowicz gave a multimedia presentation spanning the 1960's history of the Beatles, part history and part musical analysis.

Decoding African American Spirituals – *Montague Center Public Library*

A sing, hum, clap, stomp-along concert for the entire family presented by Gloria Matlock and Michael Nix offered guests a highly interactive and educational journey through significance of spirituals and our nation's narrative.

Get Ready for Kindergarten: ArtWeek Edition! – *Franklin Public Library*

This 45-minute program featured stories, songs and crafts, all designed to prepare children for preschool and kindergarten. Special for ArtWeek, stories of famous artists and hands-on crafts were intertwined into the festivities!

Contemporary Printmaking-Creative Innovations - *Osterville Village Library, Cape Cod*

A special artist collaborative held an interactive reception that coincided with an exhibit where artists led a special talk-back about the inspiration behind their work and techniques used.

Folktales From Around the World – *Hyannis Public Library, Cape Cod*

Storyteller, Janet Glantz, told stories from around the world. Children and families were invited to play along with the stories via sing-a-longs, finger play, and other interactions.

Working With Editors – *Marston Mills Library, Cape Cod*

This "Behind the Scenes: Working with Editors" featured local authors and editors who talked about how they work together and how it can make or break the final result.

Treasures of the State House Library – *State House, Boston*

A VIP behind-the-scenes 'white glove' tour of this little known gem showcased historic journals, maps, and other treasures not usually seen by the public.
