Florence Price was the first African-American woman to be recognized as a symphonic composer and to have a composition played by a major orchestra. In 2009, a substantial collection of Price's works and papers was found in an abandoned house on the outskirts of Chicago, Illinois. Among these works was "Abraham Lincoln Walks at Midnight," a 30-minute piece for chorus, soloists, and piano, set to a poem by Vachel Lindsay. Join the Andover Choral Society and director Michael Driscoll for a historical presentation given by choral member David Fitch, focusing on Price's life and works. Then stay around, if you wish, to hear the chorus rehearse for its upcoming May 4 performance of "Abraham Lincoln Walks at Midnight" and songs of George Gershwin. This is a free event, but to attend you must register by Sunday, April 28. This event was awarded a 2019 Music Drives Us grant.

Before the school was founded, the children who lived in the remote villages near his home village of Namche Bazaar had virtually no access to primary school education. The closest school, part of the network of Hillary Schools named after the famous British climber, Sir Edmund Hillary, was almost half a day's walk away, and, as a result the kids in these remote villages were unable to be educated. After the screening, the director will hold an interactive discussion with the audience.

Working in this intersection of art and science, the artists will bring the micro-organisms into the macro. This expression of microbiology through art will connect the current work of students in Gloucester with its artistic tradition in a way that reflects the changing environment around us.
