Linda Davey of timewellspt will teach a class on making sourdough bread from spent beer grain in the Second Wind Brewing taproom. Sourdough has been used as a leavening dating back to the Middle Ages. It is a captured yeast, rather than a commercially cultivated bakers yeast (which originated as a by-product of the beer brewing process). When properly fed, prior to use, sourdough cultures can last hundreds of years and are often shared among bakers. You can easily cultivate your own sourdough starter culture, but we will be using one that has been in use for several years. Adding spent grain to the dough gives the natural yeast an additional source of sugar to use in the fermentation (rise). (As a side note, the term "culture" is thought to have originated from the sharing of fermentation cultures among travelers.)
